Liturgy of the Word

Responsorial Psalm	<i>Join my prayer to Jesus' prayer.</i>
Second Reading	<i>Jesus teaches me to stop sinning and follow Him.</i>
Alleluia	<i>Alleluia welcomes Christ to speak to me through the Gospel.</i>
Gospel	<i>Pay attention: I want Jesus in my mind, words and heart. Jesus teaches us in stories about His life, death, and resurrection.</i>

Liturgy of the Eucharist

Preparation of the Altar and the Gifts	<i>We join together and prepare for the transubstantiation.</i>
Eucharistic Prayer	<i>Pay Attention! Most important prayer in mass, asking the Lord to be our food.</i>
Consecration	<i>Ask the Lord to bless our bread and wine in the words of Jesus at the last supper.</i>
Transubstantiation	<i>The bread and wine become the body and blood of Christ. God is here in the flesh!</i>
Lord's Prayer	<i>We ask for everything we need and for forgiveness the way Jesus taught us.</i>
Sign of Peace	<i>Pray others into heaven and that they feel the love of Jesus and the peace it brings.</i>
Breaking of the Bread	<i>We break the bread to share Jesus as our food.</i>
Communion	<i>We receive the body and blood of Christ.</i>
Prayer after Communion	<i>We wish everyone communion blessings.</i>

Concluding Rite

Blessing	<i>This is the last sign of the cross, make it count.</i>
Dismissal	<i>We are "sent away" to love and serve God, and Jesus is with us.</i>
Closing Song	<i>We are not sent away alone. Jesus and others are with us in our mission.</i>

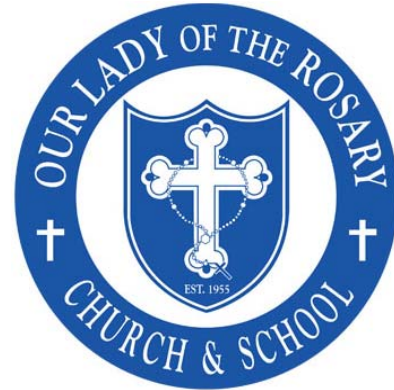
